
## **Paradise Comics to Close Filament Incubator's Inaugural Season**

George has flown the coop, leaving thirteen year-old Beans and her mother, Janie to clean up the mess. In the process of removing his clutter from their home, the pair is charged not only with organizing the transport of an entire comic book collection, but forced to face the responsibility they shared for a man they each knew so differently. *Paradise Comics* contemplates the trials of adolescence and parenting, and how families grieve. Paradise Comics is written by Caitie Graham (*poseball*, New Ideas Festival) with direction from Darwin Lyons (*Well Born*, SocoTheatre/Truth'n'Lies Theatre) and dramaturgy from Paula Wing (*Accidental Death of an Anarchist*, Soulpepper Theatre).

Set in an intimate basement in Kensington Market, *Paradise Comics* is the eighth and final piece of theatre in Filament Incubator's 2016 season and part of their #8showsin8months, opening after Lauren Griffiths's '*Til Death do Us Part* and Aaron Jan's *Swan*, a co-production with Little Black Afro. It will star **Sherman Tsang** (Hart House, Youth Ensemble Theatre), **Maddie Bautista** (2016 SummerWorks Spotlight Award for Performance), **Sarah Naomi Campbell** (*We Three*, Cue 6; *The Winter's Tale*, Leroy Street Theatre), and **David Ross** (Shakespeare BASH'd). *Paradise Comics* was workshopped in Tarragon's Young Playwright's Unit in 2013 and again in Ryerson's 2014 New Voices Festival under Sheldon Rosen.

**FILAMENT INCUBATOR** was founded with the express intent to be a launching pad for underproduced and underrepresented emerging artists, programming them on a consistent, monthly basis in the Queen West Area. The Incubator is the collective brainchild of Daniel Bagg, Aaron Jan, Andrew Markowiak, and Zachary Parkhurst.

Since graduating from the Performance Acting Program at Ryerson University in 2014, Caitie Graham has become a committed member of the theatre and youth education community in Toronto, as well as an advocate for work that engages young women. Her play, *Paradise Comics*, was developed at the Tarragon Theatre's Young Playwright's Unit; a program for which she now acts as Assistant Writing Instructor. It was first produced in her graduating year at the Ryerson New Voices Festival, and has since received dramaturgical support from Paula Wing in preparation for the remount with Filament Incubator this November. Her writing work has most recently appeared at the Alumnae Theatre's New Ideas Festival (*POSE BALL pt.1*), and with Then They Fight's *10/10/10 Project* (swimmer), and has always reflected her interest in, and commitment to, the storytelling of Toronto youth. Catch a staged reading of *pose ball* in its entirety this fall at the Tarragon Theatre.
